Matt. 12:7; Hosea 6:6

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vs1-2 The disciples pluck grain as they walk Pharisees accuse them of violating Sabbath Deut. 23:25 Accuse, impose Jn. 5:10; Mt. 15:2; 23:16, 18 vs3-4 Jesus asks them about David

- Would they all answer the same way
- Any answer they gave pointed attention back to God's law

- Jesus' point is that His disciples are guiltless

vs 5 Jesus says the priest profane the Sabbath and are blameless

- they appear to profane the Sabbath to someone who does not know the law

- v6 One greater than the temple
- v7 I desire mercy and not sacrifice
 - likely some of the same people as 9:13
 - remember the people of Hosea's day (4:1, 6)

- show mercy by not condemning the guiltless and by only teaching God's law

v8 the Son of man is Lord even of the Sabbath Mk. 2:27 The Sabbath was made for man, and not man for the Sabbath.

Summary of Jesus' Response

- 1. David's example: God's law
- 2. Priest's work: God's law
- 3. One greater than temple: His authority
- 4. "Mercy, not sacrifice": Pharisees lacked
- 5. Lord of the Sabbath: His authority
- 6. Sabbath made for man: purpose of Sabbath

- Mercy and genuine sacrifice go together in true religion 1 Jn. 5:3
