

Definition

OT (Hebrew): to depress, i.e. prostrate (especially reflexive, in homage to royalty or God):--bow (self) down, crouch, fall down (flat), humbly beseech, do (make) obeisance, do reverence, make to stoop, worship.

NT (Greek): to fawn or crouch to, i.e. (literally or figuratively) prostrate oneself in homage (do reverence to, adore):--worship.

Definition

So Moses made haste and bowed his head toward the earth, and worshiped.

Exodus 34:8 NKJV

Definition

And he said to Him, "All these things I will give You if You will fall down and worship me." Matthew 4:9 NKJV

"Stay here with the donkey; the lad and I will go yonder and worship, and we will come back to you." Genesis 22:5 NKJV

Definition

So David arose from the ground, washed and anointed himself, and changed his clothes; and he went into the house of the LORD and worshiped. 2 Samuel 12:20 NKJV

... who exchanged the truth of God for the lie, and worshiped and served the creature rather than the Creator, who is blessed forever. Amen. Romans 1:25 NKJV
